## facilities—

ARTISTS-IN-RESIDENCE stay at the historic Villetta Inn, built in 1903—a spacious, rustic building with communal dining and living rooms. Each resident has his or her own bedroom and separate studio space. Residents prepare meals in the large, well-appointed kitchen. Typically, residents choose to collaborate on meals.

## length of stay—

Each session lasts four weeks running from June through mid-September. Check this year's dates on our web site.
